Judy Pfaff is a vibrant installation artist who began her career in the 70's, and as part of her prolific career has received many awards including a John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation Award (2004); a Bessie (1984); and fellowships from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation (1983) and the National Endowment for the Arts (1986). Judy's work incorporates sculpture, painting, and architecture in her built environments that emphasize how space can expand and collapse.
